1. Coldwater River Macroinvertebrate Survey – Saturday, October 10th

After missing our spring macroinvertebrate survey on the Coldwater this past May, we are planning to start back up with an October survey. This is a great "hands on" learning opportunity for those who have not experienced a macroinvertebrate survey.

The project takes approximately 4 hours on Saturday morning, while teams survey one of 5 stream sections, collecting insects with seines, recording the stream habitat, and returning to the meeting point to identify and count the insects collected. Our data aids in planning future restoration project and is uploaded to a statewide database.



The Coldwater River is located approximately 15 miles southeast of Grand Rapids, MI. Many volunteers combine the project with fishing on local rivers such as the Coldwater, Rogue and Muskegon on Friday, Saturday afternoon or Sunday.

Kent Kleckner, proprietor of Bear Creek Anglers, has volunteered to support our group & help with local knowledge, fly selection, dining options, etc. You can explore a number of high quality streams including the North Bear, South Bear, Waterloo, Trout Run, Coldwater, Patterson and French Creek. You may choose to stop at Bloody Run or the Paint on your drive to or from Chicago.

Fishing in NE Iowa is typically outstanding. Naturally reproducing Browns are abundant. Iowa performs extensive stocking of Rainbows which are usually not too hard to find. Iowa's trout fishing season extends throughout the full year (trout season in Wisconsin & Iowa will be closed)
