The criteria for OBTU's "Silver Trout" award include:


- 1. Conservation Impact

Marvin Strauch, Education Chairman and longtime OBTU leader sums up the award as follows: "While the award recognizes chapter performance over the past year, OBTU's ability to win this recognition is clearly a culmination of 50 years of contributions by a very long line of generous volunteers who have worked well together and have built our outstanding TU chapter. For instance, OBTU has had 19 dedicated volunteers serve as chapter president who have passed the torch from one to the next over the past 50 years."

More about Trout Unlimited (National)

Trout Unlimited is the nation's oldest and largest cold water conservation organization. Trout Unlimited currently has 386 local chapters in 35 states with 300,000 volunteer members. Members work to fulfill this cold-water conservation mission through their advocacy, fundraising, work on conservation projects on nearby cold-water streams and rivers, and providing extensive education services. There are four chapters with over 2400 members in Illinois. These four Illinois chapters are the Elliott Donnelley chapter (Chicago and nearby), the Oak Brook chapter (western and southern suburbs, and downstate), the Gary Borger chapter (northern suburbs), and the Lee Wulff chapter (northwestern Illinois). Chris Wood, Trout Unlimited President and CEO (since 2009), will be travelling from TU's National Office in Arlington, Va. to speak at our 50th event. Wood, who started at TU over 20 years ago, has grown the organization into an internationally respected conservation powerhouse with an annual budget approaching \$100 million. Based on his conservation accomplishments, Chris was admitted into the fresh water fishing Hall of Fame in 2021.





OBTU has a special affinity for Brook Trout since it is native to the upper Midwest and Eastern parts of North America as well as being such a beautiful fish. Sadly, native Brook Trout populations have declined significantly in our region. Brook Trout restoration is one of many cold-water conservation issues where OBTU invests some of the chapter's time and conservation dollars.
